groundbreaking ceremonies for the Charles R. Drew Charter School Senior Academy at the Charlie Yates Campus were held on January 15. Georgia Governor Nathan Deal, Cousins Properties Chair Emeritus and East Lake Foundation board member Tom Cousins and representatives from Atlanta Mayor Kasim Reed's office, along with most of the Atlanta Public Schools Board of Education, were among those taking part in the event.

The 200,000 square foot, state-of-the-art facility is being built adjacent to the current Drew Charter School campus, on the former back nine holes of the public Charlie Yates Golf Course. Features include Project-Based Learning and science laboratories, flexible classroom spaces to accommodate various class sizes and collaborative groups, integrated arts studios and a three-story learning commons to support research, writing,

features also include full athletic facilities and a 500-seat theater that wil also host professional performances and be made available to other neighborhood schools.

Drew Charter School Senior Academy will welcome its first freshman

class of 100 students this summer in temporary facilities. Once completed in June, 2014, the new building will be home to 600 Drew Senior Academy (grades nine through 12) students, along with 400 Junior Academy students(grades six through eight). ■
