Vice President Biden visited the East Lake Early Learning Academy at the East Lake Family YMCA, one of the two early learning partners in the East Lake Foundation's cradle-to-college education pipeline that educates children from birth through high school. The East Lake Early Learning Academy serves children from birth to three years old, preparing them for pre-kindergarten with the social, emotional, language and literacy skills essential to students' early development.



The First Tee® of East Lake's golf camps and tournaments serve more than 150 youth every summer and provide opportunities for participants to learn and play golf, as well as develop the skills and character traits that will serve them well both on and off the golf course.

Through the East Lake Community Learning Garden's GreenWorks GRO program, young adults learn the fundamentals of organic gardening, good nutrition, urban agriculture, produce marketing/sales, animal husbandry and landscaping. A joint effort of the East Lake Foundation and the Southeastern Horticultural Society, this program provides summer job training and employment opportunities for The Villages of East Lake and East Lake community residents. For high school students, the CREW Teens Summer Institute provides courses led by professionals in a variety of fields that combine interactive classroom instruction with reallife experiences. The Institute also offers college readiness and The First Tee® of East Lake



standardized test tips. Additionally, the Drew Charter School Literacy Center's reading program helps students maintain their reading skills during the break to counter the "summer slide" phenomenon, where students are said to lose knowledge over the summer months.
