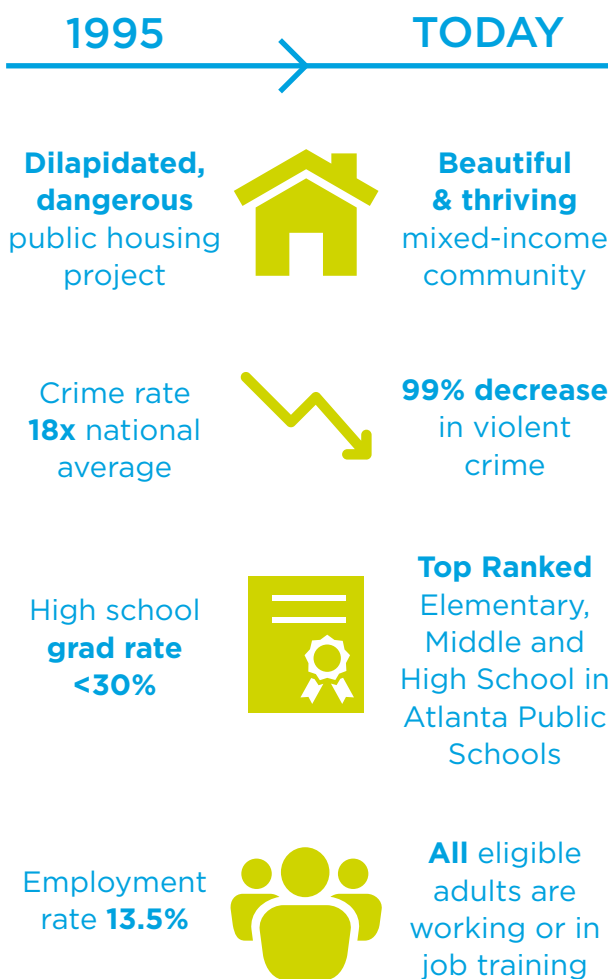

AN INTEGRATED, HOLISTIC APPROACH WITH PARTNERS

CRADLE-TO-COLLEGE EDUCATION

Drew Charter School and its early learning partners represent the cradle-to-college pipeline in the East Lake community, educating more than 1,900 students each year.



HIGHLIGHTS: Drew Senior, Junior, and Elementary Academies each rank in the **Top 10 in all of Atlanta Public Schools**. Drew consistently ranks in the **top 10% in APS** and **top 20% in the state of Georgia**.

MIXED-INCOME HOUSING

What was once a dilapidated, dangerous public housing project is now a vibrant mixed-income rental community with 882 apartments.



HIGHLIGHTS: The Villages of East Lake (VOEL) finalized an extensive renovation to its legacy properties that were constructed in the mid-late 90s. **This investment in VOEL is one of the largest preservations of affordable housing in the city of Atlanta's history.**

Today, there are 27 additional Purpose Built Communities across the country — all of which are successfully creating opportunities for residents and building strong, economically diverse communities.
